



Francesca Martini has a PhD in administrative law and, since January 2023, she is an assistant professor at the Center for Higher Defence Studies (CASD) – School of Advanced Defence Studies, for the scientific disciplinary sector. She is also subject expert in public law at the Department of Political Sciences of the University of Pisa. She qualified to practice as a lawyer in October 2001 and, from 2009 to 2020, he practiced at the courts of Pisa and Livorno, mainly in the field of administrative law, IT law and administrative maritime law.

On 23 June 1998 she graduated from the University of Pisa with a thesis in administrative law, she obtained the title of doctor in research on 29 March 2004 within the first edition of the doctorate course in "Law of computerized administrative activity and of public communication" carried out by the associated universities of Pisa, Trento, Naples L'Orientale and Cagliari, discussing the thesis "New Organizational Models for the sharing of public information assets". She subsequently dealt with the issue of the government of public information technology, realizing countless publications, including the monographic work "The public information system", published by Giappichelli, Turin,

2006.

From 2011 to 2013 she was Research Fellow at IUSS (University Institute of Higher Studies) of Pavia in public economic law dealing with environmental law and incentives for local policies in the field of environmental sustainability.

From 2004 to 2014 she was a contract professor at the University of Pisa with teaching assignments at the Naval Academy of Livorno, the Faculty of Law, the Logistics Systems Pole of Livorno, the School for Legal Professions.

She has also carried out teaching activities in the context of countless university Masters among which we recall the masters realized by the University of Pisa in Open Source Software Management, Management of Healthcare Companies and Business Jurist and Public Manager.

She has implemented the knowledge of administrative law also through employment experiences within public entities. From August 2022 to January 2023 she was employed at the Ministry of Education and Merit as a High Professional, from November 2020 to October 2021 she was a legal consultant on staff to the councilor for the environment of Rome Capital, and from 2011 to 2013 was a researcher at the Port Authority of Livorno.

From July 2014 to June 2019 she also held the position of Councilor of the Municipality of Livorno with responsibility for innovation, personnel, legal affairs, employment, economic development, university research training, European funds and international relations.
